My dear Mrs. Tallant.

I have been delayed in answering your letter, because of lack of information, any records of my father's people, must have been lost, and I know very little about them.

But feel assured if any of your father's people ever lived in or near Hamburg they must have been related to mine, because the Cooleys to whom I am related are the only ones that ever lived there.

I wrote to an uncle who lives in Los Moheros Calif. ^{north of Chico} thinking he might have the desired information, but his parents died when he was only ten and for many years he made his home with my father, (Millard F. Cooley) and so like myself knows very little.

I have written to an Aunt on my mother's side who is past seventy years, she may be able to tell me some thing worth while.

I have three uncles living, in fact they are my nearest relatives for all of

my own family are dead.

Uncle Walter and Charles used to live in Chico Calif. and Uncle Will in Chico ^{East} Utah, and the last named might perhaps give you more information.

Will give you the information I have now but have no dates, correct births or deaths.

My ^{great} grandfathers name was, (according to my Uncle Charles Cooley,) Aron Wood Cooley his brothers names, James Armstrong, Cooper, Beswick and one sister, Jane.

The grandfather was English and Grandmother German.

They settled in South Eastern Iowa. Grandfather was born in Iowa and Grand Mother in So. Carolina, her name Paulena Cox (known mostly as Polly).

My father had four brothers, Will, Edward, Walter and Charles and one sister Sarah.

My father died about five years ago, Uncle Edward several years ago and Sarah when quite a young girl, I never knew her.

Mrs. Frances Cooley might have been my great grandmother if she James Armstrong Cooley and the one you ask about are

one and the same.

My Uncle thought that the old Bible was in my mother's possession, but she has been dead many years and I never remember seeing it.

Some of my husband's people came from Ohio, but they do not remember an Elwing Liggett.

I'm sorry indeed that I cannot give you more explicit information in regard to the family history, should I get any more definite data will be glad to forward them to you.
